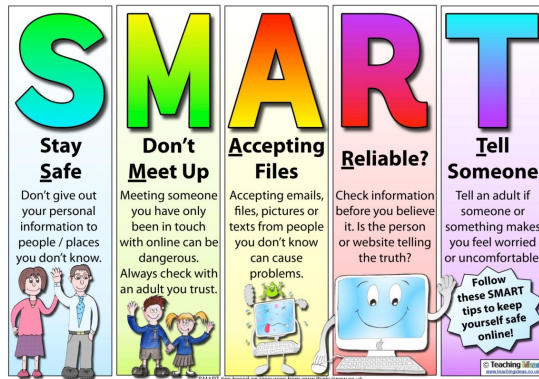

Internet Safety—Be SMART

## Vocabulary

1	Fire Safety	Fire safety refers to the set of precautions, procedures, and measures taken to prevent fires, minimize the risk of fire-related accidents, and ensure the safety of individuals and property in the event of a fire.
2	Stop, drop and roll.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>To STOP whatever you are doing</li> <li>DROP to the floor and cover your face</li> <li>ROLL three times each way until the flames are extinguished.</li> </ul>
3	Sun Safety	Slip on sun protective clothing, slop on water resistant, broad spectrum, SPF30 or higher sunscreen and slap on a broad-brimmed hat. We now know you need two more crucial steps to maximise your sun protection: seek shade and slide on a pair of sunglasses.
4	Internet Safety	Never post or trade personal pictures. Never reveal personal information, such as address, phone number, or school name or location. Use only a screen name and don't share passwords (other than with parents). Never agree to get together in person with anyone met online without parent approval and/or supervision.
5	Trusted Adult	Trusted adults are people whose words and actions make you feel safe. Trusted adults act this way both online and offline.
